

Articulation Agreement
Henry Ford College
Associate of Arts in Criminal Justice - Law Enforcement
with
Madonna University
Bachelor of Science in Criminal Justice

Madonna University ("MU") and Henry Ford College ("HFC") have entered into this articulation agreement (the "Agreement") to facilitate the educational mobility and transfer of students from HFC to MU. (HFC and MU may also be individually referred to herein as a "party" or an "institution" and collectively as the "parties" or the "institutions.")

Article I

MU and HFC enter into this Agreement as cooperating, equal partners who shall maintain the integrity of their separate programs, while working together to ensure a smooth transition for interested students.

Article II

MU and HFC agree that any student who has earned an Associate of Arts degree in Criminal Justice - Law Enforcement at HFC may transfer the identified credits toward a Bachelor of Science degree at MU in Criminal Justice (the "Bachelor's Degree"), subject to MU's then current transfer policies and procedures. MU's Bachelor's Degree graduation requirements for students who follow this Agreement are as follows:

- A. An Associate of Arts degree in Criminal Justice - Law Enforcement and with MTA endorsement from HFC with a minimum of 60 semester hours, including in the courses noted in the appendix to this Agreement.
- B. The completion of a program of study in Criminal Justice at MU with a minimum of 120 semester hours, including in the courses as outlined in the appendix.
- C. A grade of 2.00 or better is required of courses for transfer to MU and for the courses in Criminal Justice at MU.
- D. Under this Agreement, HFC students are required to complete a minimum of 6 semester hours of Signature Course requirements at MU to obtain a Bachelor of Science degree in Criminal Justice at MU. Students must also meet all other then current requirements needed for a Bachelor's Degree as noted in the appendix.

Article III

A student must comply with the then applicable individual program requirements that are in effect at the time the specific program is selected.

Graduates of HFC with an Associate of Arts Degree in Criminal Justice - Law Enforcement and with MTA endorsement from HFC under this Agreement will receive equal consideration with other applicants seeking admission to the Bachelor of Science degree in Criminal Justice at MU or financial aid.

Article IV

MU and HFC agree that a person who has completed an Associate of Arts in Criminal Justice - Law Enforcement from HFC may graduate from MU with a Bachelor's Degree without duplicative study at MU by following the articulated plan appended in this Agreement.

Article V

To the extent permitted by applicable law, including the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act ("FERPA"), 20 U.S.C. § 1232g, and its implementing regulations, 34 C.F.R. § 99.1 et seq., HFC and MU will share data on student achievement to assess program effectiveness. MU and HFC agree to communicate annually any curriculum changes or policies that affect this Agreement. Both parties reserve the right to amend or revise by mutual consent and in writing this Agreement or to change curriculum, whenever feasible.

HFC will designate an official(s) who will be responsible for all aspects of the articulation program at HFC. MU will designate individual(s) responsible for all aspects of this Agreement at MU.

The term of this Agreement shall be for a period of five years, unless earlier terminated as provided herein; provided, however, that MU and HFC will review this Agreement annually and make adjustments or amendments as deemed appropriate to maintain the integrity of each institution as well as for the improvement of the transfer process and student articulation. If agreed upon, pending review, a renewal of this Agreement for an additional five-year term may be signed by authorized representatives of both institutions.

Article VI

The two institutions further agree to communicate the established relationships pursuant to this Agreement to their respective communities.

Article VII

Students enrolled in HFC courses shall be required to comply HFC's policies and pay program approved tuition and fees. Students enrolled in MU courses will be required to comply with MU policies and pay program approved tuition, fees, and applicable living rates.

Both parties reserve the right to change their tuition and fees for any component of their respective programs. Students already progressing through a program may experience a change of tuition and fees in line with changes affecting all other students in the same program at their respective institutions.

Federal regulations generally require that students receive financial aid from only a single institution from which courses are taken during a given quarter or semester. Accordingly, advisors should recommend that financial aid recipients take all their courses in a given quarter

or semester at either HFC or MU. If a student attends both HFC and MU in a single semester, financial aid may be granted from only one institution unless the parties enter into a separate written consortium agreement to allocate and distribute financial aid for applicable students between HFC and MU.

Article VIII

Either MU or HFC may terminate this Agreement at any time with or without cause by notifying the other party in writing sixty (60) days in advance. Should the Agreement be terminated, any HFC student that has elected the articulation program pursuant to this Agreement and has enrolled at MU prior to termination will be allowed to complete the program within a five-year period of time.

All matters relating to the validity, interpretation, performance or enforcement of this Agreement, and any claims arising from or related to this Agreement, will be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the United States of America, State of Michigan, without regard to the principle of conflict of laws. Any litigation arising from or related to this Agreement may be brought only in the Federal or state courts of Michigan located in Wayne County, and the parties irrevocably consent to the jurisdiction and venue of such courts. The undersigned agree, by their respective duly authorized representatives, to the terms and conditions of this Agreement.

If any provision of this Agreement is declared by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid for any reason, such invalidity shall not affect the remaining provisions, and such remaining provisions shall be fully severable, and this Agreement shall be construed and enforced as if such invalid provisions never had been inserted in this Agreement.

Notices required under this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be sent registered mail or certified mail, return receipt requested. Such notices shall be addressed to the parties at the addresses set forth below, or at such other address as may be specified by either party. The parties may otherwise communicate by email.

The parties agree that they will not discriminate against any student in the program because of race, color, age, sex/gender, sexual orientation, gender identity, gender expression,

religion, national origin, height, weight, marital status, disability perceived disability, political affiliation, familial status, veteran status, genetic or other characteristic protected by law in the performance of programs and services under this Agreement, consistent with federal and state laws and with the non-discrimination policies of each party.

The parties agree that they will provide appropriate accommodations and services for all individuals with disabilities who are protected by the Americans with Disabilities Act and make sure that all of their programs are also accessible and comply with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA), Rehabilitation Act of 1973, and in particular, the provision that illegal discrimination by either party may be considered a material breach of this Agreement.

Statutory and common law theories and principles of indemnification, contribution, and equitable restitution, including, but not limited to, the comparative negligence law of the State of Michigan, shall govern and apply to claims, actions, causes of action, costs, expenses and losses (including attorneys' fees) resulting from or caused by the actions or omissions of the parties or their employees pursuant to this Agreement.



The signatories below warrant they are authorized to enter into this Agreement on behalf of their respective party.



- The Michigan Transfer Agreement (MTA) will satisfy all Madonna University Core Courses. MTA does not satisfy Madonna University Signature Courses.
- Madonna University will transfer a Maximum of 90 credits from community colleges towards the minimum total of 120 semester hours needed for a first Bachelor degree unless otherwise stated in the articulated agreement. Courses must be approved for transfer, non-remedial and have a grade above a 2.0 ("C") or higher. Students pursuing a course of study under an existing articulation agreement should contact Madonna University's Articulation Specialist, Chelsea Driscoll - cdriscoll@madonna.edu in the Office of the Registrar to discuss approved and maximum credit allowance.
- Students who are pursuing or who have earned the MACRAO Transfer Agreement should contact Madonna University as the requirements in the Core Curriculum will vary.
