**ARTICLE I
STATEMENT OF PARTNERSHIP**

Henry Ford College (HFC) and the University of Michigan-Dearborn (UMD) will maintain the integrity of their separate programs and enter into this agreement as cooperating educational institutions.

**ARTICLE II
AGREEMENT OF PRINCIPLE**

Henry Ford College and the University of Michigan-Dearborn agree that any student who has earned an Associate in Arts degree from Henry Ford College with a concentration in Law Enforcement or Corrections/Probations and Parole may transfer credits up to a maximum of sixty-five (65) semester credits toward the Bachelor of Arts degree in Criminology and Criminal Justice Studies at UMD. The graduation requirements are expressed as follows:

1. An Associate in Arts degree from HFC in the Law Enforcement or Corrections/Probation and Parole concentration may transfer credits that will apply to the Bachelor of Arts degree in Criminology and Criminal Justice at UMD.
2. The Michigan Transfer Agreement (MTA) endorsement must be earned at HFC prior to enrollment at UMD in order to ensure that all courses selected from the appended guide will transfer.
3. Requirements for students who follow this agreement assume completion of a total of at least 120 semester credits, including those transferred from the Associate degree at HFC.
4. Applicable courses with a "C" grade or above will transfer for credit.
5. Students must meet all admissions requirements including a minimum recalculated grade point average of 2.5.

**ARTICLE III
AGREEMENT ON PROGRAM SPECIFICS**

Henry Ford College and UMD agree that any student who has satisfied the minimum requirements outlined in the attached articulation guide may transfer the course credits indicated on the guide toward a CCJ degree at UMD. Under this agreement, UMD will waive the 62-hour maximum transfer credit rule and permit these students to transfer up to a maximum of 65 credit hours without duplicative study by following the appended guide and receiving the MTA endorsement at HFC. HFC students will receive equal consideration with other students seeking admission and financial aid.

**ARTICLE IV
AGREEMENT ON COMMUNICATION**

Henry Ford College and UMD agree to cooperate in communicating with each other and with their common and respective parties concerning the established relationship between the two institutions. Communication may include the development of various kinds of publications to inform those who might benefit personally or professionally from the opportunities provided by this agreement. Faculty and staff at both institutions will share the information in this agreement with interested and qualified students and both institutions will provide counseling and advising to students and prospective students.

**ARTICLE V
MAINTENANCE AND REVIEW PROCEDURES**


At least one administrator or faculty member from each institution will be appointed to act as agents for the implementation of this agreement, to speak for the institutions and to communicate changes to respective advisors, counselors, and others to whom the information is pertinent. Responsibility for oversight of this agreement rests with the Director of Criminology and Criminal Justice at UMD and the Associate Dean of Social Sciences, Arts and Fitness at HFC. Both parties agree to communicate frequently with regard to any changes in their respective programs which may affect this articulation agreement.

Effective period: August 31, 2017 until August 31, 2020.


Students who began this program prior to the expiry of the effective period may use this articulation agreement. If this agreement is not renewed at the end of the effective period, students who have already started the program will be given an additional two years to be admitted to UMD under the terms of the agreement.
