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Additional Information:

- 1. In completing the coordinated program of study for this articulation agreement, course substitutions should be made with the guidance of the advisors (indicated below) at both institutions to assure that all requirements are satisfied. Each institution will determine the satisfaction of their individual program and degree requirements. HFC courses with an * are required for EMU's Industrial Distribution Program.
- 2. Students whose transcripts have the "MTA Satisfied" endorsement will only be required to complete one "Perspectives on a Diverse World" course, one "Learning Beyond the Classroom" (LBC) experience, and a Writing Intensive course in the major. The Perspectives on a Diverse World requirement may be transferred to EMU.

To use the Michigan Transfer Agreement (MTA), students must have an official community college transcript, with the "MTA Satisfied" endorsement, sent to EMU's Admissions Office. Students who do not have "MTA Satisfied" on their community college transcript, will be required to satisfy EMU's general education requirements as listed in the Undergraduate Catalog. The MTA may be completed after admission to EMU, however, students should inform their advisor in order to receive appropriate advising.

- 3. Only courses with a grade of "C" or better (2.0 on a 4.0 scale) will be accepted for transfer to EMU.
- 4. Under this agreement, EMU will waive the 60-hour rule and require that a minimum of 30 credit hours must be completed at EMU, 15 hours of which must be in program requirements at the 300-level or above. Of the last 30 hours completed before graduating, a minimum of 10 credit hours must be in EMU courses. Although 48 hours in EMU courses are listed on the articulation guide, it may be possible to transfer additional courses from HFC or another college, as long as the minimum of 30 credit hours is completed at EMU. A minimum of 124 credit hours, completed in-residence or accepted in transfer, is required for graduation. Courses listed on this guide may be completed at the most opportune time for students, whether before or after admission to EMU, as long as appropriate pre-requisites are satisfied.
- 5. Students must meet all admission requirements at the time of application for admission to EMU, including submitting transcripts from all previously attended colleges. HFC students will receive equal consideration with other students for course registration and financial aid.
- 6. Students are encouraged to contact the Industrial Distribution Program Coordinator early, before applying to EMU. To facilitate the evaluation of transcripts, students should indicate they are using this articulation guide on their application to EMU and bring a copy to all advising sessions. Effective Dates: September 1, 2012 until August 31, 2015. This is a renewal of an agreement made in September 2008. Students who began this program prior to the new effective date have the option of changing to this guide. If this agreement is not renewed at the end of the effective period, students who already started the program will be given an additional three years to be admitted to EMU under the terms of this agreement.
